THE CHARLES FLANNERY AMERICAN LEGION, BERKS LEAGUE SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION PROCESS

The eligible American Legion Berks League Baseball Player must:

- 1. Be a high school senior and accepted into an accredited university, college, or trade school.
- 2. Have played at least 1 year of Berks League American Legion Baseball.
- 3. Be in the top 50% of their graduating class with at least a 2.5 GPA.

The Applications MUST contain the following items:

- 1. A completed Charles Flannery Scholarship Application Form
- 2. Evidence of high school class rank and or GPA. Photocopies of most recent transcripts will suffice.
- 3. Confirmation of one year participation in American Legion Berks League Baseball. This confirmation may be included in the letter of reference from the Legion coach.
- 4. An essay in 250 words written by the applicant, explaining why they should be the Charles Flannery Scholarship honoree.
- 5. Three letters of reference, one from the Legion coach, and two from non-family members.
- 6. A list of school activities and community service activities the applicant has participated in (Scouts, Church, Fire Department, Food Bank, Nursing Home etc.) with the approximate hours spent in these said activities and/or volunteered in community service.

Hello Legion ballplayer,

Thank you for applying for the Charles Flannery Scholarship for Berks League American Legion baseball players. Through the application form and accompanying written essay, the Flannery family gets to know each of the applicants and their qualifications and interests. We would like for you to know something about the person this scholarship honors, Charles Flannery.

"Charlie", as most who knew him, spent his life loving the game of baseball as far back as a kid playing on the Essick playground in the City Recreation program in Reading. Then later on playing fast-pitch softball with the Wyomissing Polytechnic Institute. In his early adult life he spent his time instilling the love of the game in the young people he meet through all the volunteer organizations he took part in as a coach. He started his coaching career with the Optimists Boys Club, then on to Northwest Athletic Association and West Reading Juniors. He coached the Pulaski Post American Legion team for 3 seasons, and then on to Gregg Post "Keys" American Legion team for 31 seasons with 254 victories after "Cooter Jones" stepped down. Charlie Flannery is in the Pennsylvania State American Legion Hall of Fame for his contributions to the game. He was also the President of the Berks County American Legion Baseball League from 2006-09. Also volunteering his time behind the scenes, he lead a group of baseball minded guys in the refurbishing of Reading's George Field as a charter member of "Operation Knight Lights" where they upgraded the dug outs, concession stand, locker rooms and put up the lights for night games.

Baseball was his first sports love, but he was active in basketball as well. He was a PIAA referee from 1967 to 1992, a coach with the Optimist Boys Club, the Reading Jewish Community Center coach from 1971 to 1993, served as Secretary of Berks County Basketball Old Timers from 2001-2013, and was the chairman of the Basketball Hall of Fame Committee from 2007-2012.

Charlie was a Reading native and graduated from Reading High School in 1952 and went on to earn a degree from Wyomissing Polytechnic Institute in 1957. After completing his education, he served active and reserve duty in the United States Army, graduating from the Provost Marshall General School as an "MP" (military police). After his service in the Army he served 4 years in the United States Air Force Reserves as a first sergeant and member of the Air Police in a Recovery Squadron at the Reading Airport. As a Veteran he was a proud member of Gregg Post #12 American Legion, serving as Treasurer, which brought him full circle from where he starting out as the American Legions baseball coach of the Gregg Post Keys. In his later years he served as the Gregg Post Liaison Officer to the Mohnton Naval Sea Cadets where he taught the Cadets military protocol and instructed them in becoming an Honor Guard group for military ceremonies. The Naval Sea Cadet Honor Guard was frequently used as the Honor Guard when Charlie arranged for families of local Veterans to honor their loved ones service with a Flag Dedication ceremony and Fightin' Phils home games—In recognition of giving his life to the game of baseball, the Reading Fightin' Phils Organization made Charlie Flannery the 2014 "King of Baseballtown". He also got the Sea Cadets involved in several community service projects such as updating the Veterans listed as being interred in the Wyomissing Mausoleum, and placing tlags at each one.

So as you read this summary of Charlie Flannery's lifetime of dedication to youth sports and the needs of his community that he helped fill, his family would like you to think about his life's philosophy, with this excerpt from his obituary he himself wrote:

"My life has been full and I feel it has been spent making a difference in the lives of all I have enjoyed knowing each step along the way"

He asked that those who knew him carry on where he left off, to make this world a better place.

In closing, the Flannery family wanted you to know what kind of man this scholarship honors and hopes that you as a Legion ballplayer applicant will take his philosophy to heart and let it inspire you in your life too.
